# Phase 2

 Four-week writing workshop that will engage youth in learning, brainstorming, testing, and creating new artistic works. Students will work with industry professionals to assist with performance, recording, and production of their work.



# Phase 4

Students will be invited to take part in the Project Iconic Showcase to display and perform our pieces at Park Avenue UMC. The showcase will invite local community members, Park Avenue church parishioner's and established local artist to applaud the students for their work and investment into their craft.

# Phase 1

Four-week open mic night that will invite young artist in our community to come and share their gifts and talents with the community. All art forms are accepted for reflection.



# Phase 3

Students' projects will be professionally mixed & mastered and submitted for distribution as a collaborative album. Which will then be published to digital service providers such as iTunes, Apple Music, Spotify, Google Play, Amazon Music and more. All proceeds of the project will be fed back to the project for new students each year.
